NAIDOC Week with Professor Lisa Jackson Pulver AM



The guest speaker at Sydney Rotary Club's NADOC Week lunchtime meeting on Tuesday 10th November will be Professor Lisa Jackson Pulver AM, an epidemiologist and researcher in the area of Aboriginal health who has been Deputy Vice Chancellor at the University of Sydney since October 2018. Professor Jackson Pulver will discuss the key areas of the new Indigenous strategy for the University of Sydney titled 'One Sydney Many People' including progress and initiatives to date and the focus for the future to 2025.

She was the first known Aboriginal person to receive a PhD in medicine at the University of Sydney.
