The Royal Australian Mint has announced the launch a pair of coins in 2021 for Rotary's centenary. A \$1 coin will go into general circulation and also be available in a commemorative collectors pack for \$15. A special minting of a silver \$5 coin will be available for \$100 marking 100 years of Rotary service and launching into the next 100 years.


## Member Profiles: Tom Anderson & Mark Dyer

Tom has qualifications in Politics, International Relations and International Communication from Macquarie University. He began his career working in Canberra with former Attorney General of Australia, the Hon. Philip Ruddock. After the 2015 NSW state election Tom moved from federal to state politics, working as a Research Assistant to the Deputy President and has been serving as Chief of Staff to the President of the Legislative Council, the Hon. John Ajaka MLC since May 2019.

Tom joined Rotary to connect with other Global Citizens who utilise their varied skills towards altruistic ends. His interests include reading, film and architecture.



Mark Dyer has lived with his Sydney family on the traditional lands of the Guringai people (Lane Cove) now for around 20 of his 25 years in Sydney. Julie & Mark moved to Sydney in the late 1990s after he was relocated by ANZ in 1996. They were married in Melbourne in 1998 and now have 4 kids, 2 of each of the traditional genders. A car dealership that he worked at over the school holidays when he was 17 didn't offer him an apprenticeship so he went back and completed his High School Certificate. He and Julie met as co-workers for ANZ in the early 1990s but soon after Julie studied nursing and is now a senior nurse in Drug & Alcohol at St Vincent's Hospital. He kept on in finance and when he joined Rotary in 2002 he was operating his own equipment finance business. In 2010 he accepted a position with the Macquarie Group in auto finance which he held until early 2019. Rotary keeps Mark busy on the youth committee however he also enjoys playing and watching sports and making things out of wood.


#### Walk for Peace - Canberra 2021
